- (b) What physical quantities are conserved during elastic and inelastic collisions? 2

- (b) What would be the speed of a body so that its moving mass is twice its rest mass? 2

3. (a) Derive the expression for the moment of restoring couple in the case of a solid cylinder of length L when it is twisted through an angle θ radian at the free end. Compare this moment with that of a hollow cylinder of the same length, material and mass. 6
- (b) Show that Poisson's ratio lies between -1 and 0.5 . 1

- (a) Deduce Poiseuille's equation for the flow of liquid through a narrow horizontal tube. 5
- (b) The excess pressure inside a soap bubble of radius 8 mm balances 2 mm column of oil of density 0.8 g/cm^3 . Calculate the surface tension of the soap solution. 2
4. (a) What are the specific heats of an ideal gas? Find the relation between them. 1+4=5
- (b) Density of hydrogen at NTP is 0.000098 g/cm^3 . Find the r.m.s. velocity of hydrogen molecules at NTP. 2
