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1. PROFESSIONAL ETHICS AND CODE OF CONDUCT FOR FACULTY AND STUDENTS

Ethics is the core of human relationship between ourselves and the world around us. The purpose and role of ethics is multilayered. It includes the preservation of the human being as a person, human dignity, value system and the conditions for leading a good life.

The term ethics and values education apply to all aspects of education which either explicitly or implicitly relate to ethical dimensions of life and are such that can be structured, regulated and monitored with appropriate educational methods and tools. Professional ethics are principles that dictate the behaviour of a person or a group of persons in a business or work environment. Like values, they provide guidelines on how a person should act towards other people and institutions in such an environment,

The college has certain rules and regulations by which teacher-student and student – student relationships are maintained. Primarily, it has also adopted the code of Professional ethics outlined by the UGC.

Code of professional ethics extracted from UGC regulations on minimum qualifications for appointment of teachers and other academic staff in universities and colleges and measures for the maintenance of standards in higher education, 2018

I. Teachers and their Responsibilities:

Whoever adopts teaching as a profession assumes the obligation to conduct himself / herself in accordance with the ideal of the profession. A teacher is constantly under the scrutiny of his students and the society at large. Therefore, every teacher should see that there is no incompatibility between his precepts and practice. The national ideals of education which have already been set forth and which he/she should seek to inculcate among students must be his/her own ideals. The profession further requires that the teacher should be calm, patient and communicative by temperament and amiable in disposition.

Teacher should:

(i) Adhere to a responsible pattern of conduct and demeanour expected of them by the community. (ii) Manage their private affairs in a manner consistent with the dignity of the profession; (iii) Seek to make professional growth continuous through study and research; (iv) Express free and frank opinion by participation at professional meetings, seminars, conferences etc., towards the contribution of knowledge; (v) Maintain active membership of professional organisations and strive to improve education and profession through them; (vi) Perform their duties in the form of teaching, tutorials, practicals, seminars and research work, conscientiously and with dedication; (vii) Discourage and not indulge in plagiarism and other non ethical behaviour in teaching and research; (viii) Abide by the Act, Statute and Ordinance of the University and to respect its ideals, vision, mission, cultural practices and tradition; (ix) Co-operate and assist in carrying out the functions relating to the educational responsibilities of the college and the university, such as: assisting in appraising applications for admission, advising and counselling students as well as assisting the conduct of university and college examinations, including supervision, invigilation and evaluation; and (x) Participate in extension, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities, including the community service.

II. Teachers and Students

Teachers should:

(i) Respect the rights and dignity of the student in expressing his/her opinion; (ii) Deal justly and impartially with students regardless of their religion, caste, gender, political, economic, social and physical characteristics; (iii) Recognise the difference in aptitude and capabilities among students and strive to meet their individual needs; (iv) Encourage students to improve their attainments, develop their personalities and at the same time contribute to community welfare; (v) Inculcate among students scientific temper, spirit of inquiry and ideals of democracy, patriotism, social justice, environmental protection and peace; (vi) Treat the students with dignity and not behave in a vindictive manner towards any of them for any reason; (vii) Pay attention to only the attainment of the student in the assessment of merit; (viii) Make themselves available to the students even beyond their class hours and help and guide students without any remuneration or reward; (ix) Aid students to develop an understanding of our national heritage and national goals; and (x) Refrain from inciting students against other students, colleagues or administration.

III. Teachers and Colleagues

Teachers should:

(i) Treat other members of the profession in the same manner as they themselves wish to be treated;(ii) Speak respectfully of other teachers and render assistance for professional betterment; (iii) Refrain from making unsubstantiated allegations against colleagues to higher authorities; and (iv) Refrain from allowing considerations of caste, creed, religion, race or sex in their professional endeavour.

IV. Teachers and Authorities:

Teachers should:

(i) Discharge their professional responsibilities according to the existing rules and adhere to procedures and methods consistent with their profession in initiating steps through their own institutional bodies and / or professional organisations for change of any such rule detrimental to the professional interest; (ii) Refrain from undertaking any other employment and commitment, including private tuitions and coaching classes which are likely to interfere with their professional responsibilities; (iii) Co-operate in the formulation of policies of the institution by accepting various offices and discharge responsibilities which such offices may demand; (iv) Co-operate through their organisations in the formulation of policies of the other institutions and accept offices; (v) Co-operate with the authorities for the betterment of the institutions keeping in view the interest and in conformity with the dignity of the profession; (vi) Adhere to the terms of contract; (vii) Give and expect due notice before a change of position takes place; and (viii) Refrain from availing themselves of leave except on unavoidable grounds and as far as practicable with prior intimation, keeping in view their particular responsibility for completion of academic schedule.

V. Teachers and Non-Teaching Staff:

Teachers should:

(i) Treat the non-teaching staff as colleagues and equal partners in a cooperative undertaking, within every educational institution; (ii) Help in the functioning of joint-staff councils covering both the teachers and the non-teaching staff.

VI. Teachers and Guardians

Teachers should:

(i) Try to see through teachers' bodies and organisations, that institutions maintain contact with the guardians, their students, send reports of their performance to the guardians whenever necessary and meet the guardians in meetings convened for the purpose for mutual exchange of ideas and for the benefit of the institution.

VII. Teachers and Society

Teachers should:

(i) Recognise that education is a public service and strive to keep the public informed of the educational programmes which are being provided;

In addition to the professional code of ethics outlined by the UGC in its regulation, the college faculty is committed to follow the code of conduct outlined below:

- 1. The College teachers shall devote their energy to develop and improve their scholarly competence, while practicising intellectual honesty all the while.
- 2. They are committed to exercise critical self-discipline and judgment in using, extending, and transmitting knowledge.
- 3. It is the obligation of the faculty member to pursue professional and academic development.
- 4. The college teachers will make every effort to foster honest academic conduct and ensure that their evaluations of students are transparent and fair to the best possible extent.
- 5. The teachers shall respect the confidential nature of the relationship between professor and student.
- 6. Faculty members (Teaching & Non –teaching shall avoid any exploitation, harassment, or biased treatment of students on any ground.
- Faculty needs to openly express a zero tolerance policy toward academic dishonesty. Students
 who behave dishonestly should face the punitive measures consistent with the college rules and
 regulations. The code of conduct for students is regulated by the following rules of discipline for
 students.

GENERAL RULES OF DISCIPLINE FOR STUDENTS

1. SMOKING

Smoking is strictly prohibited within the College premises and is punishable with a fine of Rs. 200 (Rupees two hundred).

2. DRINKING

Drinking of any liquor with alcohol content and taking other intoxicants is prohibited within the College campus and during College functions (College Week, Inter-College Sports and other functions). Students found guilty of such prohibited acts are punishable by suspension from College for a period not exceeding one month. Such students will be prohibited from attending all other College activities/ functions. All kinds of unruly behavior, whether as an outcome of drinking alcohol or not, is strictly prohibited. Habitual offenders will be expelled from College.

3. CELL- PHONES

Active use of Cell-phone/ Ipods/ Music Players during lecture classes and practical classes is not allowed. Anyone found misusing such gadgets and indulging in such acts will have the material confiscated and parents will have to collect the same, with a fine, from the Principal.

- 4. **DRESS CODE:** All students are expected to come to College in decent costumes. Proper haircuts/ hairstyles must be maintained by all students in and around the campus.
- 5. **RESPECTING TEACHERS:** Students are expected to show respect to all teachers regardless of whether they are directly taught by them or not. Stern action will be taken against students who are disrespectful to teachers in words or in actions.

RULES OF DISCIPLINE IN CLASS ROOMS AND LABORATORIES

1. LATE ARRIVAL

Late arrival into Classrooms/ Laboratories is a breach of discipline. A student will not be allowed to enter the Classroom /Laboratory 15 minutes after classes have commenced.

2. CLASS TESTS/INTERNAL EXAMS

- a) All students are expected to appear in class tests and other internal examinations.
- b) All students must submit Laboratory Records and Assignments on time. Failure to turn in such works is a breach of College Rules and is punishable.

3. ATTENDANCE MATTER

- a) All students are expected to be regular in attendance
- b) A student must fulfil 75% monthly attendance failing which Parents/Guardians will have to meet the Principal.

4. MATTER REGARDING ABSENCE AND LEAVE

- a) Staying away from college without proper leave will not be tolerated, except when the case is sudden illness or unforeseen circumstance.
- b) After an absence from college, students must submit a letter of absence to the Principal duly signed by Parents/Guardians.
- c) Application for leave on Medical ground should be supported by authentic medical documents.
- d) Unauthorized absence from College at a stretch for a period exceeding 15 days may result in the student having his/ her name removed off the rolls and may not re-admitted.

5. MATTERS RELATING TO ATTENDANCE BY-PROXY

Tendering one's attendance through proxy is a serious breach of discipline. The punishment of guilty students is as follows:

- a) For every single offence, the attendance given through proxy plus three previous classes attended of the concerned students will be summarily cancelled.
- b) Students acting as proxy and found marking attendance of classmates have three class attendance records cancelled from the total attendance.

4. Brief Introduction of the Department (maximum 200 words):

The Department of Biochemistry was established in 2004 in this college to encourage and cater to the growing demands for Applied Science in today's scientific sector. It was started under the Headship of Pu Laltanpuia, Associate Professor, GZRSC with minimal number of faculty, mostly through internal arrangements. As the department has eventually obtained Provisional Affiliation from Mizoram University in 2005, more batches of students were being enrolled each year and have passed out successfully during the past years.

Biochemistry was offered as an Elective Subject since its establishment, mostly due to lack of the prescribed number of teaching faculty and minimal status with respect to infrastructure, laboratory conditions, equipment and others.

However recently, the existing four (4) faculties which comprises of 3(three) regular faculties and 1(one) contract faculty were added with two (2) more, one from RUSA and another Casual Teaching Faculty from the Directorate, H&TE. Hence, application for starting Core Course in Biochemistry was immediately initiated and has *been granted a Provisional Application to start Core Course in Biochemistry subject from 2021-2022 academic session by the 40th Meeting of the Academic Council (Dt 29.06.2021), vide its Resolution No. AC:40:4(17): I.*

Also, all members of the department are actively involved in framing the new core syllabus (UGC Module for UG Biochemistry: Learning Outcome based Curriculum Framework LOCF) which was approved by BOS, Biotechnology, MZU on 18th Oct, 2022, approved by School Board, Life Sciences, MZU on 3rd Nov, 2021 and final approval by Academic Council, MZU on 3rd Dec 2021.

Since then, new batches of core students were admitted from 2022-23 academic session and the present biochemistry students were also offered core from their 5th semester.

The subject books in the library are 442 nos, supplemented by 659 books in Botany and 642 books in Zoology. Recently, added by few more books from 20 different authors. 2 (two) subject specific / allied journals are being subscribed along with numerous E-books.

4. Brief Introduction of the Department (maximum 200 words):

The Department of Chemistry was started in the year 2000. There are 3 class rooms and 2 laboratories. At present there are 8 faculties in number according to the documents of Higher & Technical Department, Govt. of Mizoram following the attachment of Dr. Lalsaimawia Sailo from Govt. Saiha College. But in reality, the teachers who engaged in teaching are only 6. Among the faculty, Mr. Laltanpuia is on deputation as Additional State Project Director, RUSA and Dr. Zirlianngura is also on deputation as NSS Nodal Officer under Sports and Youth Services Department, Govt. of Mizoram. As Chemistry is the central subject, majority of the students choose Chemistry as one of their elective subject. So, the teachers who can engage in teaching are less according to the number of students, theory and practical classes.

Chemistry Department offers three main branches of Chemistry - Organic, Inorganic and Physical Chemistry. Besides these, other branches like Analytical Chemistry, Industrial Chemistry, Natural Products, Medicinal, Environment, Green Chemistry and Material Chemistry are also included in the syllabus. The teachers are also very hard working for the students, they conduct remedial & special classes for Chemistry students and repeaters from time to time. The faculties are regularly involved in setting questions, moderation, and evaluation of the university examination. Most of the students come from remote villages of Mizoram, they are average or below average students in their academic records. But due to the high efforts given by teacher and students in studies, we always have university rank holders. Besides class room teaching, students are also guided to visit industry and other important places, guide and help them to participate in Science exhibition which are related to their syllabus.

4. Brief Introduction of the Department (maximum 200 words):

The Electronics department has been introduced to keep pace with emerging trends in the field of research and development. Conventional subjects in computer era will not be able to provide sufficient information to the fast-growing technology. Knowing this basic need, the college also put forward a proposal for establishing Electronics department in 2002 to Government of Mizoram. At the same time, requirements were collected and after receiving a green signal, Electronics Department was established in 2003 starting with first year B.Sc. students. The first batch appeared for exam in 2003 under NEHU.

At first the Department was manned by three permanent teachers. However, two of them left the college and joined the Mizoram University as faculty members and since then the department is looked after by one Permanent teacher with two Guest Lecturers. In addition, another temporary faculty left the department and joined as Academic Officer at Mizoram Board of School Education (MBSE) in 2017. On 17th March 2020, a new faculty has joined the department as Assistant Professor under RUSA scheme. In December 2019, a new faculty has joined the department as Casual Asst. Professor.

As per the letter No. MZU/CDC-3/9/20/2480 issued on 10th July 2020; for the first time the department has opened a **core course** for a period of one-year for the time being and is extendable based on performance and circumstances in accordance with the 38th meeting of the Academic Council on 23th June 2020, Vide its Resolution No. AC: 38:4(14): III (A).

Now the department is looked after by five (05) Assistant Professors. Dr. Ricky Lalhmangaihzuala took the H.O.D (Head of Department)'s charge on 18th July, 2019 till date. *Type of affiliation*: Temporary to MZU.

4. Brief Introduction of the Department (maximum 200 words):

The study of Home Science in college was initiated with the emergence of the then 'Zirtiri Women's College', the only women College in the state way back in 1980. In those days two years Pre-University Course (PU) equivalent to Class 11 and 12 today was included in the college. Hence, students started learning Home Science right after passing Class 10. Mrs. Lalziki Sailo, the first Principal and the founder of the college had initiated the introduction of Home Science course(stream) in the college influenced by her mentor, Mrs. Chapman, a pioneer Missionary from the West. Hence, Zirtiri Women's College used to offer two streams namely Arts Stream and Home Science Stream.

B.Sc Home Science is a degree course mainly comprises of the study of major topics of Home Science like Food, Nutrition and Dietetics, Resource Management, Human Development, Fabrics and Apparel Science. In other word, B.Sc Home science is a degree course that includes the study of many disciplines such as Chemistry, Physiology, Biochemistry, Economics, Rural Development, Child Development, Hygiene, Sociology, Family Relations, Community living, art, food, nutrition, Clothing and Textile, Home Management etc.

At present, the department is functioning with 12 Faculty members of different disciplines, one Laboratory Assistant and one Laboratory Bearer. The department has 3 laboratories. E GOVERNANCE POLICY

With the advancement in technology, the college has decided to implement e governance in its various operations to ensure transparency, accountability, efficiency, dissemination and easy access of college related data in various operation of the college. With the adoption of e-governance, time and cost of teaching may reduce tremendously. Faculties can work both at the college and home as information will always be available within hailing distance. The college also resolved to adopt paperless in the college administration by utilizing ICT to a maximum extend. The ICT Committee of the college are given responsibilities to maintain and update the college website.

Area of operation in implementing e-governance in the college:

1. Website

The website is the information backbone of the institution where all the activities and information about the college, departments etc are displayed. Important notice and activities of the collegeshould be flashes in the website. The ICT committee will be responsible to update the website regularly.

2. Library

Library is equipped with computers, scanner, CCTV and active internet connection. Library software "SOUL 2" was installed from 2012. The library faculty is responsible in registering all the books available in the library. Issue and return should be monitored using this software. The librarian is encouraged to subscribe more e-journals and e-books for the year to come. The students are also encouraged to use the network resource centre of the library to access e-books and e-journals.

3. E-Learning

The college gradually migrate from the chalk and duster days of teaching to the new elearning technology. Classrooms are equipped with projectors and most of the teachers use powerpoint presentation and audio/video tutorial in teaching. Several trainings have been organised for the teachers so as to utilize ICT based in teaching. All the teaching faculty must be able to take classes online by using google meet, zoom, webexetc and set up e-classroom or virtual classroom such as moodle and google classroom.

4. Student admission

Since 2018, the student can apply for admission online and after clearing the selection process, payment can be made online. IMADE services provide the payment gateway for

free which is integrated in our college website. This will help in transparency in transaction and reduce the administrative work.

5. Examination

For the external university examination, it is mandatory to upload all the information online. The college use the university portal to enter all examination related information. Internal marks are entered online. Hall ticket/Admit card are also downloaded online. The student can also pay examination fee online. All the examination process is monitored by the examination committee under the guidance of the principal. They must ensure confidentiality in the student marks. Internal marks and attendancce are to be submitted by email or whatapp to the exam secretary.

6. Administration

The administrative office is also equipped with computers, scanner/printer and internet facilities. Most of the administrative work are done using computer. Most of the service related forms for facilities will be available in soft copy.

7. Management Information System

MIS software for the college was developed by HL Solutions. Enrolment of the student, internal marks and attendance can be entered into the MIS which will provide easy access of information of all the students of the college. All departments should enter their internal exam marks, and student attendance by using the college MIS and this information will be made available only within the institution.

8. Alumni

Inorder to interact closely with the alumni, there is an alumni page in the website. This alumni page is taken care by one of our alumni member. In this page, individual alumni can register themselves and a list of alumni are displayed in the page alongwith their pictures and present designation/status. They can also post alumni activities. There is an alumni feedback page where alumni can post theirfeedback on the college and its activities.

9. Teaching Management

Institutional Policy for the Disabled

Following The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016, the institution gives special consideration during admission to 'person' with 'benchmark' disabilities by way of reserving not less than 5% seats. He/she will not have to face an interview and there will be 25% marks waiver in the total marks obtained in the last examination; they will also be given 50% waiver in the fees to be paid. To avail this reservation, a person will have to produce a photocopy of an authentic certificate given by a government authorized/recognized body or office.

*Benchmark disabilities as defined by Section 34 of the Right of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016: (a) blindness and low vision; (b) deaf and hard of hearing; (c) locomotor disability including celebral palsy, leprosy cured, dwarfism, acid attack victims and muscular dystrophy (d) autism, intellectual disability, specificlearning disability and mental illnesses

The new campus has been designed such that it has disabled-friendly buildings equipped with ramps and elevators for people on wheelchairs and locomotive disabled persons. The institution also provides human assistance whenever necessary.

INSTITUTIONAL POLICY FOR AWARDING ENDOWMENT FUND TO STUDENTS

The Institute has been providing endowment fund to its students since 2015.Contribution is collected at Rs 100 per month from permanent teachers and Rs 50 per month from temporary teachers. The Students Support Committee has been appointed to collect the monthly contribution from the faculty members who have accrued as endowment fund for poor students. The practice of awarding financial assistance to needy students has been introduced to help the economically backward students who are unable to pay their tuition fees. The following procedures have been laid down by the committee for award of endowment fund to students.

- 1. The Committee will give a notification to students and teachers as to when the financial aid will be provided.
- 2. It will normally be given once a year and whenever emergency case arises.
- 3. After announcement of dates the committee will give out a common application form to teachers.
- Students in need of financial assistance will be identified through the mentoring system and the application form will be submitted to the committee.
- Once the students are identified they will be interviewed personally by representatives of the committee to hear individual cases. The financial assistance will be given at this time.
- Each student receiving the financial aid will give their signature in the register maintained by the committee.
- 7. During the pandemic, when offline classes have been suspended, students in need to financial aid will be identified and interviewed by their mentors.
- 8. During the suspension of offline classes the case history of each student will be recorded by the committee in a common format.
- 9. The students who have been identified will be credited through online banking.

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INSTITUTIONAL POLICY ON CONTINUOUS ASSESSMENT TEST

The followings are the policy formulated by Examination Committee which will be strictly followed by concerned faculty and students –

- Continuous Assessment Test (CAT) will be conducted in the form of two Internal Examination and one seminar/assignment.
- Internal examination routine will be prepared by Examination Committee as per academic calendar and all stake holders will be informed in advance.
- 3. Attendance of students should be taken in each and every exam.
- Evaluation should be completed by concerned teachers within the stipulated time(normally within a week after the assessment)
- Mentors are to record the marks of their mentees and discuss their performance in the assessment.
- The evaluated answer scripts should be returned to the students to make room for complaint in regards to awarding of marks (if any) and correction should be made accordingly.
- Marks awarded in each subject should be *informed* to the students before submission to Exam Committee.
- Final marks awarded by invigilator(s) should be submitted to Examination department by their head of department within one week from the date of exam and a copy should be kept by the department.
- Examination Committee will calculate final marks of students towards the end of each semester from the accumulated marks obtained in the two internal exams, seminar/assignment marks and attendance mark.
- The final marks will be displayed in the notice board of each class where students will be given an opportunity to settle wrong entry, if it happens.
